Unfortunately, we did not reach our March Reading Log Incentive goal of 5,000 minutes. 

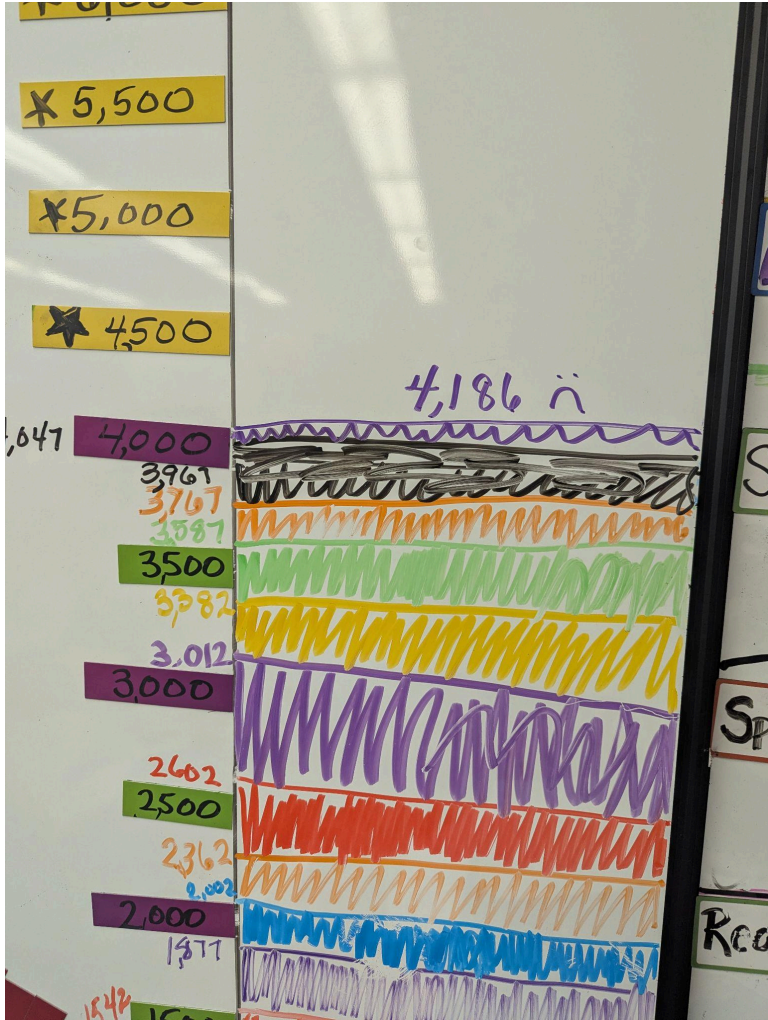
